Questions from Health Facility administrators

- Are our Hospital <u>Buildings</u> Safe?
- What can be done to reduce predominant HAZARD Risk in existing Hospital buildings?
- How safe are our equipments/ Components?
- Does the building need retrofitting? What performance?
- How do we increase our capacity for effectively responding to emergencies involving mass casualties?

How....

- Protect the lives of patients and health workers by ensuring the structural resilience of health facilities
- Make sure health facilities and health services are able to function in the aftermath of emergencies and disasters, when they are most needed; and
- Improve the risk reduction capacity of health workers and institutions, including emergency management

Overarching Goal

• Health facilities are only truly safe from disasters when they are accessible and functioning, at maximum capacity, immediately after a hazard strikes.

Outcome 1:Preparation and activation of hospital contingency plans

- All the major public and private hospitals in each of the 9 districts of Delhi prepare their respective hospital contingency (Emergency Preparedness and Response) plans in line with the standard considerations as placed in the national guidelines on medical preparedness and mass casualty management issued by NDMA (2007)
- These hospital contingency plans are to be duly validated
- The validated hospital contingency plans to be **authorized and notified**
- The hospitals activate their contingency plans

Objectives of the workshop

- To develop a common understanding on the aspects of health sector preparedness for emergencies and hospital safety
- To strengthen SOPs on emergency medical response and mass casualty management
- To strengthen existing capacities for preparation and implementation of health and hospital DM plans
