Sub: Compliance of Guidelines/ instructions of Unlock 3 issued by MHA, Gol vide Order dated 29.07.2020.

Sir,

Please find enclosed herewith DO letter 40-3/2020-DM-I(A) dated 22.08.2020 received from Home Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, on the subject cited above wherein it is conveyed that Para-5 of these guidelines clearly state that there shall be no restriction on interstate and intra-state movement of persons and goods. No separate permission / approval/ e-permit will be required for such movements. This includes movement of persons & goods for cross land border trade under Treaties with neighbouring countries. However, Ministry of Home Affairs has been reported that local restrictions on movement are being imposed by various districts/states. Such restrictions, amount to violation of the aforesaid guidelines issued by MHA under the provisions of Disaster Management Act, 2005.

Aforesaid guidelines have already been endorsed / issued by DDMA vide its Order No. 275 dated 31.07.2020 (copy enclosed).

In this regard, I am directed to request you to kindly ensure strict compliance of these guidelines of Unlock 3 referred in Union Home Secretary's DO letter dated 22.08.2020, in letter & spirit and issue necessary directions to all field functionaries to not to impose any restrictions on inter-state and intra-state movement of persons and goods and services.

This issues with the approval of Chief Secretary, Delhi.
